

ORDINANCE NO. 24-959

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING RATES AND FEES TO BE CHARGED BY CLARKSVILLE CONNECTED UTILITIES; DELEGATING AUTHORITY OVER CERTAIN FEES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the City of Clarksville, Arkansas (“City”) is the owner and regulator of a municipal utility providing electric, water, wastewater, and broadband services; and

WHEREAS, on or about 8th day of May, 2023, the City created a commission known as the Clarksville Connected Utilities Commission of the City of Clarksville, Arkansas (“Commission”) for the purpose of operating and managing the City’s municipal utility in accordance with Ark. Code § 14-201-201 et seq., and the authority granted by the City; and

WHEREAS, the City withheld from the Commission the authority to establish rates and standard fees, except to the extent that the Commission charges less than the amount authorized by the City; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that certain electric rates charged by the Commission are inadequate to recover the cost of providing electric service and that a rate adjustment is necessary to maintain financial stability within the electric utility; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that certain utility service fees are inadequate to recover the costs related thereto and seeks authority to establish fees that reflect actual costs; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has requested the City to adopt the rates and delegate authority over fees as described in this ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Clarksville, Arkansas that:

Section 1. Residential Electric Rates. Clarksville Connected Utilities is hereby authorized to charge for residential electric service amounts that do not exceed the rates described on **Exhibit A-Electric-2024** which is attached to this ordinance and incorporated herein as if set forth word for word. For purposes of this ordinance, “residential electric service” shall mean service that is provided to a home for household purposes. Clarksville Connected Utilities may assign an appropriate commercial rate to: (a) any home, where the predominate use of the premises, not separately metered, is used for commercial or other purposes, as determined by Clarksville Connected Utilities; (b) any home with commercial or other activity that causes average electric consumption or peak demand to exceed the average electric consumption or peak electric demand of other residential electric customers in the City by more than 100% for more than three months in any calendar year; (c) a home that has an electric peak demand greater than 50 kilowatts at any time.

Section 2. Single-Phase Commercial Electric Rates. Clarksville Connected Utilities is hereby authorized to charge for single-phase commercial electric service amounts that do not exceed the rates described on **Exhibit B-Electric-2024** which is attached to this ordinance and incorporated herein as if set forth word for word. For purposes of this ordinance, “single-phase commercial electric service” shall mean electric service, other than residential electric service (Exhibit A-Electric-2024) or special electric service (Exhibit F-Electric-2024), that is provided to a location that has a peak demand that is less than 50 kilowatts through a single-phase electric connection.

Section 3. Three-Phase Commercial Electric Rates. Clarksville Connected Utilities is hereby authorized to charge for three phase commercial electric service amounts that do not exceed the rates described on **Exhibit C-Electric-2024** which is attached to this ordinance and incorporated herein as if set forth word for word. For purposes of this ordinance, “three phase commercial electric service” shall mean electric service, other than special electric service (Exhibit F-Electric-2024), that is provided to a location that has a peak demand that is less than 50 kilowatts through a three-phase electric connection.

Section 4. Large Commercial/Industrial Electric Rates. Clarksville Connected Utilities is hereby authorized to charge for large commercial/industrial electric service amounts that do not exceed the rates described on **Exhibit D-Electric-2024** which is attached to this ordinance and incorporated herein as if set forth word for word. For purposes of this ordinance, “large commercial/industrial electric service” shall mean electric service, other than special electric service (Exhibit F-Electric-2024), that is provided to a location through a single-phase or three-phase electric connection that has a peak electrical demand that is greater than or equal to 50 kilowatts.

Section 5. Power Cost Adjustment. Clarksville Connected Utilities is hereby authorized to charge electric service customers for increases in the cost of wholesale power above budgeted amounts and credit electric service customers for decreases in the cost of wholesale power below budgeted amounts according to the formula attached as **Exhibit E-Electric-2024**. The Power Cost Adjustment shall not apply to security light service.

Section 6. Special Electric Rates. Clarksville Connected Utilities is hereby authorized to charge for special electric service amounts that do not exceed the rates described on **Exhibit F-Electric-2024** which is attached to this ordinance and incorporated herein as if set forth word for word. For purposes of this ordinance, “special electric service” shall mean: (1) security light service and (2) service provided to the City of Clarksville, Arkansas.

Section 7. Amendment to Clarksville Municipal Code Section 4.04.20. Section 4.04.20 of the Clarksville Municipal Code is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

“Section 4.04.20 Electric rates for Clarksville Connected Utilities. The Clarksville City Council hereby determines that the following rates schedules are just and reasonable, and hereby directs Clarksville Connected Utilities to charge and collect from customers an amount that does not exceed the amount shown for electric services provided to the customer classes described below as soon as administratively practical, but not later than December 31, 2024:

- A. Residential electric service rates shown on Exhibit A-Electric-2024.
- B. Single-Phase commercial electric rates shown on Exhibit B-Electric-2024.
- C. Three-Phase commercial electric rates shown on Exhibit C-Electric-2024.
- D. Large commercial/industrial electric rates shown on Exhibit D-Electric-2024.
- E. Power cost adjustment shown on Exhibit E-Electric-2024.
- F. Special electric service rates shown on Exhibit F-Electric-2024.

Until such time that the rates and charges described in this section are implemented, Clarksville Connected Utilities shall continue to charge and collect rates according to rate schedules that were effective immediately prior to the approval of these rates. All previously approved electric rates and charges in conflict with this section shall be repealed upon implementation of the rates and charges described in this section.

Clarksville Connected Utilities is directed to maintain a copy of all applicable rates and charges on its website in a manner that is available for public inspection.”

Section 8. Amendment to Clarksville Municipal Code Section 10.04.13. Section 10.04.13 of the Clarksville Municipal Code is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

“10.04.13 Establishment of fees The Clarksville Connected Utilities Commission may adopt charges and fees which may include:

- A. Fees to recover costs related to the city’s Pretreatment Program;
- B. Fees to monitor, inspect, and maintain surveillance of wastewater discharges and wastewater control facilities;
- C. Fees to review accidental discharge procedures and construction;
- D. Fees for permit applications;
- E. Fees for filing appeals;
- F. Fees for consistent removal (by the city) of pollutants otherwise subject to Federal Pretreatment Standards;
- G. Fees for Wastewater Discharge Permits and Wastewater Contribution Permits; and
- H. Other fees as the Commission may deem necessary to carry out the requirements contained herein.

Fees established pursuant to this section shall not exceed the amount that generally reflects the average cost incurred by Clarksville Connected Utilities to provide the services associated therewith. The fees described in this section solely relate to wastewater services provided by Clarksville Connected Utilities and are separate from all other fees chargeable by the city or Clarksville Connected Utilities.”

Section 9. Amendment to Clarksville Municipal Code Section 10.04.14. The first three sentences of Section 10.04.14 (currently misnumbered as Section 10.02.14) of the Clarksville Municipal Code are hereby amended to read as follows:

“10.04.14 Permits required All significant users proposing to connect to or to contribute to the POTW shall obtain a Wastewater Discharge Permit before connecting to or contributing to the POTW.

Users required to obtain a Wastewater Contribution Permit shall complete and file with the Commission, an application in the form prescribed by the Commission, and accompanied by the fee established by the Commission.”

The remainder of Section 10.04.14 shall be preserved within the Clarksville Municipal Code as currently stated.

Section 10. Amendment to Clarksville Municipal Code Section 10.08.04. Subsection A of Section 10.08.04 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

“A. Fixed fee charges for wastewater services shall be applied per water meter connection (excluding sprinkler meters and other meters that do not flow to the wastewater system) on a monthly basis regardless of consumption quantity based on the customer class.”

Section 11. Amendment to Clarksville Municipal Code Section 10.08.06. Subsection H of Section 10.08.06 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

“H. Fixed fee charges for water services shall be applied per water meter connection on a monthly basis regardless of consumption quantity based on the customer class.”

Section 13. Amendment to Clarksville Municipal Code Section 4.04.21. Section 4.04.21 of the Clarksville Municipal Code is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

“Section 4.04.21 Connection to the Electric Distribution System. Except for service provided under Rate Schedule L (Security Light Service), all connections to the City’s electric distribution system shall be metered. All load connections and connections of generators operating in parallel with the City’s electric distribution system shall comply with the safety and operational standards of Clarksville Connected Utilities. Existing customers repairing storm damage or upgrading should contact Clarksville Connected Utilities for actual cost according to what is required. All new connections and reconnections shall be subject to the fees indicated in the table below, which includes the cost of: (1) a meter box to be installed by the customer’s electrician; (2) a standard meter installed by Clarksville Connected Utilities; and (3) up to three hundred feet (300’) of overhead Single-Phase primary service extension.

Other connection services, if required, shall only be provided at the customer’s expense, including without limitation: necessary distribution system upgrades, additional primary or secondary line extensions, underground service, nonstandard metering, nonstandard switching, and the like. For CT-metered service, the customer shall additionally provide a Unistrut rack to mount the meter base and a ditch with one inch (1”) conduit from meter base to transformer pad (Contact CCU for pad dimensions and conduit locations).”

Section 14. Severability. The provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable and, if any part of this ordinance is declared to be unlawful or unenforceable, the remainder of this ordinance shall continue to be effective.

Section 15. Conflicts Repealed. That Ordinance No. 23-914 and all other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith shall be repealed to the extent of the conflict upon implementation of this Ordinance.

Section 16. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days after passage.



RESIDENTIAL ELECTRIC SERVICE RATE SCHEDULE

EXHIBIT A-Electric-20224

Availability: At any point on the City's electric distribution system.

Application: For service to single dwelling or individual family apartments used for permanent residence, including incidental family use on the appurtenant premises, that is supplied through one (1) meter. The rate schedule is not applicable to commercial type use on the appurtenant premises such as chicken brooding. Clarksville Connected Utilities may assign an appropriate commercial rate to: (a) any home, where the predominate use of the premises, not separately metered, is used for commercial or other purposes, as determined by Clarksville Connected Utilities; (b) any home with commercial or other activity that causes average electric consumption or peak demand to exceed the average electric consumption or peak electric demand of other residential electric customers in the City by more than 100% for more than three months in any calendar year; (c) a home that has an electric peak demand greater than 50 kilowatts at any time. Service is for the use of the customer and may not be shared and may not be resold to others. Service is not applicable to standby or supplementary service.

Character of Service: Service will normally be single-phase sixty (60) cycle, at approximately 120/240 volts. However, three-phase service may be furnished if approved by Clarksville Connected Utilities.

Net Monthly Rate: For consumption beginning no sooner than the first billing cycle meter readings thirty (30) days after the effective date of approval of the rate, the total monthly bill shall be the sum of the following rate components, subject to the Power Cost Adjustment, applicable taxes, and adders for nonstandard service:

Base/Customer Charge:	\$ 20.00/month per meter
Energy Charge:	\$ 0.06100/kilowatt-hour

Base/Customer Charge: The Base/Customer Charge will be charged monthly regardless of consumption quantity based on the number of meters installed at the service location.

Energy Charge: The Energy Charge will be based upon the amount of electricity consumed by the customer during the billing period as reflected in meter readings or reasonable estimates when meter readings are unavailable.

Power Cost Adjustment: The energy charges described above will be increased or decreased to reflect the costs incurred by Clarksville Connected Utilities to purchase and deliver power to the City's electric distribution system, as prescribed in the Power Cost Adjustment calculations.

Nonstandard Service. In the event that a customer requires a nonstandard service (such as, primary line extension, additional pole(s), additional equipment, underground, etc.), the customer will pay Clarksville Connected Utilities for all estimated costs related to such nonstandard service before work to install such nonstandard service begins. When work is complete, the customer shall be refunded amounts paid for nonstandard service that exceed actual costs and shall be liable for nonstandard service costs that exceed amounts previously paid. Alternatively, Clarksville Connected Utilities is authorized, but not required, to enter an agreement for the repayment of nonstandard service costs upon terms that are acceptable to both Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

Taxes: The net monthly bill is subject to the addition of all taxes levied on power bills.

Payment: Payment shall be due fifteen (15) days from the billing date and if not paid on or before the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, a late charge of ten percent (10%) may be added to the bill. Additionally, on or about the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, Clarksville Connected Utilities shall provide notice of late payment and that service shall be subject to disconnection for nonpayment on the tenth (10th) day after such notice is sent. Notice may be provided by any means reasonably calculated to inform the customer of payment status, including but not limited to: first-class mail, prominent posting at the service location, phone, email, text messaging, or other reasonable manner of communication.

Contract Period: Month-to-month, except as otherwise agreed between Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

SINGLE-PHASE COMMERCIAL RATE SCHEDULE

EXHIBIT B-Electric-2024

Availability: At any point on the City's electric distribution system.

Application: For electric service, other than residential electric service or special electric service, that is provided to a location through a single-phase electric connection. Service will be supplied through one (1) point of delivery. The single-phase commercial rate is available to multi-residential dwellings when metered through one (1) supply point and having a peak electrical demand that is less than 50 kilowatts. Service is for the use of the customer and may not be shared and may not be resold to others. Service is not applicable to standby or supplementary service.

Character of Service: Single-phase, sixty (60) cycles and at one (1) standard delivery voltage required by customer and available at customer's service location where service is delivered and metered at voltages less than 12,500/7,200 volts with a maximum demand not to exceed fifty (50) kilowatts.

Exception: The voltage and maximum demand limitations will not apply to educational institutions (public schools, universities, etc.).

Net Monthly Rate: For consumption beginning no sooner than the first billing cycle meter readings thirty (30) days after the effective date of approval of the rate, the total monthly bill shall be the sum of the following rate components, subject to the Power Cost Adjustment, applicable taxes, and adders for nonstandard service:

Base/Customer Charge:	\$40.00/month per meter for single-phase
Energy Charge	\$0.07750/kilowatt-hour

Base/Customer Charge: The Base/Customer Charge will be charged monthly regardless of consumption quantity based on the number of meters installed at the service location.

Energy Charge: The Energy Charge will be based upon the amount of electricity consumed by the customer during the billing period as reflected in meter readings or reasonable estimates when meter readings are unavailable.

Power Cost Adjustment: The energy charges described above will be increased or decreased to reflect the costs incurred by Clarksville Connected Utilities to purchase and deliver power to the City's electric distribution system, as prescribed in the Power Cost Adjustment calculations.

Taxes: The net monthly bill is subject to the addition of all taxes levied on power bills.

Nonstandard Service. In the event that a customer requires a nonstandard service (such as, primary line extension, additional pole(s), additional equipment, underground, etc.), the customer will pay Clarksville Connected Utilities for all estimated costs related to such nonstandard service before work to install such nonstandard service begins. When work is complete, the customer shall be refunded amounts paid for nonstandard service that exceed actual costs and shall be liable for nonstandard service costs that exceed amounts previously paid. Alternatively, Clarksville Connected Utilities is authorized, but not required, to enter an agreement for the repayment of nonstandard service costs upon terms that are acceptable to both Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

Payment: Payment shall be due fifteen (15) days from the billing date and if not paid on or before the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, a late charge of ten percent (10%) may be added to the bill. Additionally, on or about the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, Clarksville Connected Utilities shall provide notice of late payment and that service shall be subject to disconnection for nonpayment on the tenth (10th) day after such notice is sent. Notice may be provided by any means reasonably calculated to inform the customer of payment status, including but not limited to: first-class mail, prominent posting at the service location, phone, email, text messaging, or other reasonable manner of communication.

Contract Period: Month-to-month, except as otherwise agreed between Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

THREE-PHASE COMMERCIAL RATE SCHEDULE

EXHIBIT C-Electric-2024

Availability: At any point on the City's electric distribution system having adequate capacity and suitable voltage for delivery of service.

Application: For electric service, other than special electric service, that is provided to a location through a three-phase electric connection. Service will be supplied through one (1) point of delivery. The three-phase commercial rate is available to multi-residential dwellings when metered through one (1) supply point and having a peak electrical demand that is less than 50 kilowatts. Service is for the use of the customer and may not be shared and may not be resold to others. Service is not applicable to standby or supplementary service.

Character of Service: Three-phase sixty (60) cycle and at one (1) standard delivery voltage required by customer and available at customer's service location where service is delivered and metered at voltages less than 12,500/7,200 volts with a maximum demand not to exceed fifty (50) kilowatts.

Exception: The voltage and maximum demand limitations will not apply to educational institutions (public schools, universities, etc.).

Net Monthly Rate: For consumption beginning no sooner than the first billing cycle meter readings thirty (30) days after the effective date of approval of the rate, the total monthly bill shall be the sum of the following rate components, subject to the Power Cost Adjustment, applicable discounts, applicable taxes, and adders for nonstandard service:

Base/Customer Charge:	\$100.00/month per meter
Energy Charge	\$0.07750/kilowatt-hour

Base/Customer Charge: The Base/Customer Charge will be charged monthly regardless of consumption quantity based on the number of meters installed at the service location.

Power Cost Adjustment: The energy charges described above will be increased or decreased to reflect the costs incurred by Clarksville Connected Utilities to purchase and deliver power to the City's electric distribution system, as prescribed in the Power Cost Adjustment calculations.

Taxes: The net monthly bill is subject to the addition of all taxes levied on power bills.

Nonstandard Service. In the event that a customer requires a nonstandard service (such as, primary line extension, additional pole(s), additional equipment, underground, etc.), the customer will pay Clarksville Connected Utilities for all estimated costs related to such nonstandard service before work to install such nonstandard service begins. When work is complete, the customer shall be refunded amounts paid for nonstandard service that exceed actual costs and shall be liable for nonstandard service costs that exceed amounts previously paid. Alternatively, Clarksville Connected Utilities is authorized, but not required, to enter an agreement for the repayment of nonstandard service costs upon terms that are acceptable to both Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

Payment: Payment shall be due fifteen (15) days from the billing date and if not paid on or before the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, a late charge of ten percent (10%) may be added to the bill. Additionally, on or about the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, Clarksville Connected Utilities shall provide notice of late payment and that service shall be subject to disconnection for nonpayment on the tenth (10th) day after such notice is sent. Notice may be provided by any means reasonably calculated to inform the customer of payment status, including but not limited to: first-class mail, prominent posting at the service location, phone, email, text messaging, or other reasonable manner of communication.

Contract Period: Month-to-month, except as otherwise agreed between Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

LARGE COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL RATE SCHEDULE

EXHIBIT D-Electric-2024

Availability: At any point on the City's electric distribution system having adequate capacity and suitable voltage for delivery of service.

Application: For electric service, other than special electric service, that is provided to a location having a peak electrical demand that is greater than or equal to 50 kilowatts. Service will be supplied through one (1) point of delivery. Service is for the use of the customer and may not be shared and may not be resold to others. Service is not applicable to standby or supplementary service.

Character of Service: Single-phase or three-phase sixty (60) cycle and at one (1) standard delivery voltage required by customer and available at customer's service location where service is delivered and metered.

Net Monthly Rate: For consumption beginning no sooner than the first billing cycle meter readings thirty (30) days after the effective date of approval of the rate, the total monthly bill shall be the sum of the following rate components, subject to the Power Cost Adjustment, applicable discounts, applicable taxes, and adders for nonstandard service:

Base/Customer Charge:	\$500.00/month per meter
Billing Demand Charge:	\$4.25/kilowatt
Energy Charge	\$0.04150/kilowatt-hour

Base/Customer Charge: The Base/Customer Charge will be charged monthly regardless of consumption quantity based on the number of meters installed at the service location.

Determination of Billing Demand: The billing demand upon which the demand charge is based shall be the Monthly Demand as determined below corrected for power factor as set forth under Power Factor Adjustment, provided that no billing demand shall be less than the highest billing demand previously determined during a twelve (12) month period ending with the current month.

- *Determination of Monthly Demand:* The customer's monthly demand shall be the greater of: (a) maximum rate at which energy is used for any period of thirty (30) consecutive minutes of the month for which the bill is rendered as shown by Clarksville Connected Utilities' demand meter, and (b) 50 kilowatts.
- *Power Factor Adjustment:* The consumer shall at all times take and use power in such a manner that the power factor shall be as nearly one hundred percent (100%) as possible, but when the average power factor as determined by continuous measurement of lagging reactive kilovolt ampere hours is less than ninety-five percent (95%) the billing demand shall be determined by multiplying the maximum demand, measured by the demand meter for the billing period by ninety-five percent (95%) and dividing the product thus obtained by the actual average power factor expressed in percent. Clarksville Connected Utilities may, at its option, use for adjustment the power factor as determined by test during periods of normal operation of the consumer's equipment instead of the average power factor.

Primary Service Discount: When all the following conditions are met, a discount of five percent (5%) of the net monthly bill computed will be allowed:

1. The customer takes service at 12,500/7,200 volts.
2. The customer owns, maintains, and operates all equipment on customer's side of point of delivery.
3. The customer pays the difference in the cost of primary and secondary metering.

When the customer qualifies and elects to take primary service, Clarksville Connected Utilities shall meter on the supply side of the customer's transformers.

Secondary Service/Primary Metering Discount: After January 1, 2025, except as provided in the grandfathered provision below, no customer receiving service at secondary voltage levels shall qualify for a primary metering discount.

Grandfathered Secondary Service/Primary Metering Discount: When a primary-metered customer does not qualify for the five percent (5%) primary service discount and Clarksville Connected Utilities chooses to meter on the supply side of the City's transformers, the five percent (5%) primary service discount will not be allowed, but the kilowatt-hours shall be decreased by the amount of the transformer losses computed as follows:

- *One percent (1%) of the total kilovolt-amperes rating of Clarksville Connected Utilities' transformers times seven hundred thirty (730) hours.*
- *The decrease in kilowatt-hours shall not exceed five percent (5%) of metered kilowatt-hours.*

A customer who qualifies for a decrease in kilowatt-hours at a service location under this provision on or before January 1, 2025, shall continue to receive such decrease in kilowatt-hours at the service location under this provision until such time service is substantially modified, transferred, or discontinued for any reason.

Power Cost Adjustment: The energy charges described above will be increased or decreased to reflect the costs incurred by Clarksville Connected Utilities to purchase and deliver power to the City's electric distribution system, as prescribed in the Power Cost Adjustment calculations.

Taxes: The net monthly bill is subject to the addition of all taxes levied on power bills.

Nonstandard Service. In the event that a customer requires a nonstandard service (such as, primary line extension, additional pole(s), additional equipment, underground, etc.), the customer will pay Clarksville Connected Utilities for all estimated costs related to such nonstandard service before work to install such nonstandard service begins. When work is complete, the customer shall be refunded amounts paid for nonstandard service that exceed actual costs and shall be liable for nonstandard service costs that exceed amounts previously paid. Alternatively, Clarksville Connected Utilities is authorized, but not required, to enter an agreement for the repayment of nonstandard service costs upon terms that are acceptable to both Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

Payment: Payment shall be due fifteen (15) days from the billing date and if not paid on or before the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, a late charge of ten percent (10%) may be added to the bill. Additionally, on or about the fifteenth (15th) day following the billing date, Clarksville Connected Utilities shall provide notice of late payment and that service shall be subject to disconnection for nonpayment on the tenth (10th) day after such notice is sent. Notice may be provided by any means reasonably calculated to inform the customer of payment status, including but not limited to: first-class mail, prominent posting at the service location, phone, email, text messaging, or other reasonable manner of communication.

Contract Period: Month-to-month, except as otherwise agreed between Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

POWER COST ADJUSTMENT

EXHIBIT E-Electric-2024

The power cost adjustment clause shall be made monthly based on a six-month period ending with the preceding month. The base cost for a six-month period is \$0.0475 per KWH after adjusting for transmission and distributing system losses. The current cost per KWH is calculated by dividing the “total power cost” by the “total KWH sold” (using power cost and KWH sold for a six-month period with the preceding month). “Total power cost” includes fees, associated costs, and other charges made by the wholesale power suppliers to the Company.

The adjustment is found by subtracting the “base energy cost” from the “current energy cost.” The adjustment is applied to all KWH as determined under each rate schedule. The adjustment is not applied to Rate Schedule L, Security Light Service.

SPECIAL ELECTRIC SERVICE RATE SCHEDULES

EXHIBIT F-Electric-2024

RATE SCHEDULE L (SECURITY LIGHT SERVICE)

Availability: For any customer at any point on the Company's distributing system.

Application: For unmetered, automatically controlled outdoor lighting service burning all night. Not applicable to seasonal or temporary service.

Character of Service: Clarksville Connected Utilities will install, own, operate and maintain fixtures, including any necessary lamp replacements. The specified rate does not include the setting of any pole; customer will be billed for any new poles to be installed.

Net Monthly Rate: For consumption beginning no sooner than the first billing cycle meter readings thirty (30) days after the effective date of approval of the rate, the total monthly bill shall be the sum of the following rate components, subject to applicable taxes, and adders for nonstandard service:

High pressure sodium light:	\$6.88 for 150 Watt
	\$13.25 for 400 Watt
Metal halide light:	\$24.37 for 1,000 Watt

Taxes: The net monthly bill is subject to the addition of all taxes levied on power bills.

Nonstandard Service. In the event that a customer requires a nonstandard service (such as, primary line extension, additional pole(s), additional equipment, underground, etc.), the customer will pay Clarksville Connected Utilities for all estimated costs related to such nonstandard service before work to install such nonstandard service begins. When work is complete, the customer shall be refunded amounts paid for nonstandard service that exceed actual costs and shall be liable for nonstandard service costs that exceed amounts previously paid. Alternatively, Clarksville Connected Utilities is authorized, but not required, to enter an agreement for the repayment of nonstandard service costs upon terms that are acceptable to both Clarksville Connected Utilities and the customer.

Payment: Payment shall be made monthly with payment for all other amounts owed by customer in accordance with the terms of the customer's class of service.

RATE SCHEDULE CITY (CITY OF CLARKSVILLE)

Availability: At any point on the Company's distributing system.

Application: For service as needed and agreed upon by the City and Clarksville Connected Utilities.

Character of service: For service needed and agreed upon by the City and Clarksville Connected Utilities.

Net Monthly Rate: For consumption beginning no sooner than the first billing cycle meter readings thirty (30) days after the effective date of approval of the rate, the total monthly bill shall be the sum of the following rate components, subject to the Power Cost Adjustment:

Energy Charge	\$0.0572/kilowatt-hour
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Power Cost Adjustment: The energy charges described above will not be adjusted to reflect the costs incurred by Clarksville Connected Utilities to purchase and deliver power to the City's electric distribution system, as prescribed in the Power Cost Adjustment calculations.
